



Our Scholarship Program - continues to deliver

In 2014, the committee members of the Old Antonian Social Club came up with a suggestion of a project to help young Antonians who are presently studying at college. Though the club has been continuously supporting cricket. rugby and activities, we wanted to pioneer in a project specifically supporting the wellbeing of very young Antonians whose parents find it tough to meet the needs of those children due to various personal circumstances.

With the fullest support of the general membership, the club decided to select suitable candidates on strict selection criteria such as educational performance, family back ground, the potential of the child to perform better in fulfilling his school ambitions. Rationale was simple as it provided a channel for our membership to payback what our Alma Mater had given us during our college days.

Recognizing our genuine efforts, College Principal, Rev Fr Henry Wijerathne appointed a student counsellor to coordinate the scheme on behalf of college. The counsellor shares the students' academic reports and other progress reports on a quarterly basis, to support the

disbursement of monthly payments.

At present 9 young Antonians are benefitted under this scholarship programme. It is very gratifying to see that that few Old Boys from Melbourne and Sydney have come forward to sponsor selected recipients, also we salute The De Alwis Foundation for sponsoring few more students from the inception of this scheme.



In 2014 we started by donating each recipient Rs 5,000/- monthly and at present the monthly scholarship amount has increased Rs 10,000 per student. Clubs' annual commitment is approximately Rs 861,000 and this support will continue till the student leaves the College.

Our annual college day celebrations, and specific

donations from old boys and well-wishers have been earmarked as the main fundraisers for the scholarship programme. First time since we started this scheme, we are also very proud to sponsor a young Antonian Seminarian who is aspiring to be a OBS Priest one day. I thank the Deputy Principal Rev Fr Dushantha Perera OSB for giving us this opportunity to show aratitude to many Benedictine monks who have served the College for many years.

We have already seen the results of this worthy project and extremely proud of the fact that two past recipients got selected to universities and another found employment at Hatton National Bank. One of the university students has volunteered to coach the college chess team.

We thank Rev Fr Henry Wijerathne, Deputy Principal Rev Fr Dushantha Perera, Student Coordinating Teacher Mrs Thushari De Silva and our distinguished old Boy Mr Ranjith Peiris for all the support towards this worthy project.

2024 Service Award Recipient – TOM DEEN

Today, we're here to celebrate a truly remarkable individual, a man whose name is synonymous with sporting achievement and excellence—Antonian Thaj Omar Marikkar Deen, or as we fondly call him, Tom Deen.

Capturing the essence of Tom's extraordinary journey in a brief five-minute speech is a challenge, but let me share some of the most memorable moments of his life.

Back in his college days, Tom was a formidable presence in both cricket and soccer. On the cricket field, Tom was a fiery fast bowler. His amazing performance against Trinity in 1953, where he captured 11 wickets, is still remembered.

Tom wasn't just a phenomenal bowler; he was also a powerhouse with the bat. At just 12 years old, he made a name for himself by scoring an impressive 210 runs in a junior game against Kingswood at Randles Hill.

In 1954, Tom etched his name in history by hitting four massive sixes against St. Joseph's at Darley Road. These monumental strikes are still celebrated in Antonian folklore as they soared into buildings far beyond the grounds, including the Bonjean Hall Tower.

His remarkable talent captured the attention of West Indian cricket legend Learie Constantine, who famously remarked, "If this boy were in England, they would be talking about him." Interestingly, all three of Tom's sons later attended St. Joseph's College.

Despite his cricketing heroics, Tom was more renowned for his achievements in soccer. He earned a spot on the national team as a schoolboy, and in 1957, he was honoured in Russia with the

Gold Medal for being the best Asian footballer.



He had the distinction of leading the Ceylon team on multiple occasions and remains the only Antonian to represent the country in soccer. Additionally, he captained the esteemed club Saunders for many years.

Rev Fr Lancfranc Amarasinghe, during the 1972 Colours Night, summed Tom's up legacy perfectly by saying, "The mere Tom memory of Deen's outstanding performances sports will mark him as one of the best all-round sportsmen our school has produced, bringing rare honour and distinction to his country."

Tom worked at Nestlé for 26 years, starting as a Sales Representative and eventually becoming the National Distribution Manager. He played a crucial role in establishing the first trade union at Nestlé.

In 1983, Tom migrated to Australia with Patricia and his four children, shortly after the riots in Sri Lanka. His passion for sports continued in Sydney, where he started as an assistant cricket coach before advancing to become the director of coaching at Eastern Suburbs Cricket Club. He worked with cricket greats like Tony Greig, Geoff Boycott, Malcolm Marshall, and Kepler Wessels. In the early

1990s, Tom had the honour of coaching a seven-year-old David Warner, who has become one of the greatest all-format batsmen of our generation.

Lending a helping hand to those less fortunate than himself is a passion in Tom Deen's life. Since coming to Australia, Tom has continued to serve the community by joining the Rotary Club of Bondi, influenced by his closest associate Phil O'Sullivan. In 2004, through the Rotary Club, Tom helped raise a staggering \$90,000 for the tsunami catastrophe that claimed many lives, including the wife of one of his closest old Antonian buddies, Joe Madawela.

Tom's first encounter with our club was in 1984, just a year after arriving in Australia, when he was invited as the Guest of Honour at the OBA Big Match in Melbourne. Since then, he has visited Melbourne on many occasions to support the club. Most recently, in 2021, Tom had the honour of being the Chief Guest at the Saint Quadrangular T20 Cricket Tournament.

I have no doubt that Tom's contributions to the Antonian fraternity would have been more visible if he had lived in Melbourne.

Today, Tom resides in Eastlakes, New South Wales, with his wife Patricia. Even in his late 80s, he defied retirement by holding a managerial position at a leading company. Now at 91, Tom remains active on numerous Antonian forums on social media.

Tom Deen's life story is a testament to what can be achieved with dedication, passion, and unwavering commitment. Let's celebrate and draw inspiration from his incredible journey.

2024 Service Award Recipient - WIJAY BANDARA

Wijayananda Bandara followed another great Antonian, the late Hon. Chandra Bandara (Wijay's older brother) into St Anthony's College. Wijay and his family hail from the hot plains of Anuradhapura where Wijay attended Anuradhapura Central until he moved to St. Anthony's College in 1957 at the age of ten years and finished his education at college in 1962.

Wijay was a hosteller starting at dorm 1 of the Rainbow Cottage. where Rev Fr Leo Nanayakkara was the warden at the time. As we all may know Rev Fr Leo Nanavakkara went to become Bishop Leo Nanayakkara. Wijay's brother Mr. Chandra Bandara was mainly instrumental in the bold decision taken to construct the Bishop Gigantic Leo Nanayakkara Memorial Pavilion Gymnasium Complex, the necessary providing inspiration, leadership guidance to make this dream come true. The Gymnasium has a floor area of 6003 sq. Ft. with provision for conductina Badminton and Table Tennis tournaments, weights and physical training.

Wijay was the quiet one in school and did not get involved in many sports activities and always stayed away from the limelight. His future development commenced immediately when he joined St. Anthony's, influenced teachers and fellow boarders such as Gerald Eude (who corrected his English) formed his first nickname "Dhobi cameded". Wijay has always commented on the fact that his knowledge of English was limited. Wijay was also known for was his long memory and hence earned the nickname "Aliya". Wijay is blessed with the same memory power today

which has helped with his long Financial Planning career through the years.



The first year in school went past very quickly and he moved to The Mansion, where Brother Macky was in charge. He recollects how he got a caning by Brother Macky for holding a torch in his eyes whilst he was coming down the steps to the study hall during recreation. During his stay at The Mansion, he joined the Double Blues Cadet Platoon, where he was nicknamed "Appey" (Hopper) by Sergeant Michael Joseph. After two years at The Mansion, he progressed to The Villa. He has said that his overall education standard gradually improved due to the guidance of Mr. Barnabus, P. Don Quintus, Mr. Mendis (Master of Discipline) and Mr. B L Fernando.



Basketball Revival in College

Basketball, perhaps the most popular sport in the world after Soccer, was unknown for at least two generations of Antonians between the years 2010 and 2022. However, with our current Principal Rev. Fr. Henry Wijeratne, BB became a reality once more in 2022.

earliest recollection Basketball (BB) at St. Anthony's (college) was in the early 1960s when V. S. K. Ranasinghe was the captain, and the team was coached by Mr. F. B. R. de Silva. This was during the time of Rev. Fr. Thomas de Zilva who was the Prefect of Games. The major boost for BB happened in 1962 when college hosted the Public Schools' BB tournament in Kandy. Much effort went into preparing the facilities, including a major overhaul of the BB court which was given a new layer of bitumen and line markings. It was an exciting time for our players and gave much needed publicity for the sport in the Central Province.

Although college did not fare too well in the tournament, we were recognized as a potential force in BB among the schools in the country. Our BB standard climbed rapidly, and we became noticed by the national BB officials through the 1960's and 1970's for our competitive performances against other major BB schools in the country. We had several of our players in the Central Province team and being noticed by the national selectors at the Public Schools' tournament.

Sadly, BB in college was suspended from about 2010 to enable erecting a new building on the site that previously had

two Tennis courts adjoining the BB court. The BB court became a convenient thoroughfare to transport materials for construction of the building. which dragged on for several years, sending BB into oblivion in college. The responsibility for seeing the building to completion fell on the shoulders of our current Principal, Rev. Fr. Henry Wijeratne. On his visit to Australia in 2012, Fr. Henry committed to resurrect BB in college as soon as the building was completed. The building has now been completed, and a new era for BB has dawned with plans being drawn for a new BASKETBALL COMPLEX like we have not seen in the 170-year history of the college.

Fr. Henry found the perfect ally he needed in Rohan Wijesinghe, the President of the Colombo branch. Together kickstarted the program. Rohan himself was an excellent BB player, having played for college and the Central Province team. Rohan sent out a circular to the College of Presidents SACKOBA in March 2022, to announce the proposal to build a BB Complex in college. This project was designed to make it the premier BB venue in the Central Province and bring back the enjoyment of the sport to college. Most importantly, the students were given the opportunity to expand their choice once again in selecting a universal sport.

The proposal for the BB Complex includes the following:

- A New BB Court with:
 - A Grade Bitumen surface
 - Fiberglass, transparent shooting Backboards and Rings of international standards, attached to concrete pillars
- Another full court of lesser quality Bitumen for practices in the adjoining land
- A concrete Half court with a portable backboard and Ring (with adjustable height) for the Primary school
- Players' change rooms, and Washrooms
- Viewing gallery for VIPs
- Electronic or Digital scoreboard
- Five Flag posts
- Concrete Terrace seating for Spectator viewing
- Floodlights for main court
- Car parking which can be used as a staff car park on school days

This Proposal was presented by Rohan to the Prior of the OSB Order, Rev. Fr. Shamindra Jayawardene and was approved without reservation. The project commenced in March 2022 with the financial support from The Access Group of companies in Sri Lanka, who sponsored the construction of the main BB court.

The Main BB court is Opened

The main Court was completed in July 2022 to the agreed specifications, at a cost of approximately Rs.4 million. This was a significant achievement against the obstacles that were faced mostly by the Covid pandemic. The new BB court was opened with "muted fanfare" in September 2022, where the focus was mainly to give thanks to God for getting the first part of the project completed and the doors opened for playing Basketball. **Fathers** Rev. Shamindra Jayawardene, Henry Wijeratne, Dushantha Perera (then Director of the Primary school. and now Deputy Principal), Rohan Wijesinghe Project leader, the Senior prefects and other distinguished personnel attended the "soft" opening of the new BB court.

What was most significant was the participation of 80 students who turned up to train to be future BB players for college. The joy that rang out from their short game of BB must have resounded in the heavens loudest of all.

Work in Progress

The immediate stages to follow in this mammoth project are the construction of the "practice court", the Half court in the Primary school and the Change Rooms. Quotations have been obtained for the Primary school Half court and portable, "height adjustable" Shooting Board. The standard height of the Rings in BB is 10 feet from the ground. In Australia, children in the ages of 10 and 11 have Rings that are 9 feet from the ground. The Rings for those below that age are at a height of 8 feet. This initiative to start BB in Primary school was a brilliant idea, and augurs well for the future of BB in college. The current quotation received for the adjustable and foldable Shooting Board and Ring is Rs. 685,000 plus transport costs. In addition, a further Rs.500,000 is estimated for the concrete half court.



Funding for and Returns from the Project

The Investment in this BB Complex is not financial alone. It is an investment in the future BB

skills of our students who will bring glory to college through which is priceless. Financially, the overall cost of the Basketball Complex project is currently estimated at between Rs.15 and 20 million. An Electronic scoreboard is a standard equipment even in the humblest of schools in Australia. Basketball is a fast game where the points scored, and "fouls" committed by each team need to be updated in real time.

This Basketball complex project has been brought to life not as a one-off investment. Whilst the initial financial investment is significant, the "Returns" from this project will be enjoyed by students for many generations to come. This BB complex will be the most complete project of its kind ever done in college, or anywhere in Sri Lanka. Apart from the sports and recreational benefits for our students, BB will be a Self-funding sport through hosting of tournaments and renting of courts to nearby schools for practice.





Antonian Cricket enjoyed another outstanding year, filled with impressive performances at both the senior and junior levels. To top it off, a former Antonian was honoured with a rare national cap, adding to the year's triumphs.

In the Schools Division 1 U15 and U17 tournaments, our boys advanced to the Semi-Finals but were unfortunately eliminated due to technicalities after rain caused their games to be abandoned. As I write, there remains some uncertainty about the final outcome of our U15 team's semi-final match against St. Peter's College.

Our First XI boys secured an impressive SIX outright victories in 16 two-day games and clinched a spot in the top 8 of Division 1 (Tier A) schools. Notably, we finished ahead of esteemed institutions such as St Joseph's College, Nalanda College, and S Thomas' College Mount Lavinia. Finishing in the top 8 has also ensured our automatic qualification to remain in Division 1 (Tier A) for the next season, which is particularly commendable, considering that schools like St Peter's College, Ananda College, and Royal College are competing in lower leagues compared to us.

Our six wins this season were registered against Dharmaraja College, Ananda College, St Sebastian's College Moratuwa, St Benedict's College, Nalanda College and Gurukula MV Kelaniya. We lost outright to Mahanama College and DS Senanayake College. Despite our successes, a victory against Trinity College continues to be elusive, at least for now!

Chamidu Wickremasinghe emulates Murali

Our 2022 skipper Chamindu Wickremasinghe (aka Chamidu) became the first Antonian since the legendary Mutthiah Muralitharan to represent Sri Lanka at the highest level, when he made his T20I debut against India at Pallekelle in late July.



Followina notable some contributions for SL U19 side, where he opened both the batting and bowling, Chamidu secured a regular place as an allrounder at Sinhalese Sports Club (SSC). Most recently, he rose to the limelight at the Lankan Premier League (LPL), representing Dambulla, where he earned the Emerging Playing of the Season Award for his exceptional performances with the bat and the ball.

At school, Chamidu made a name for himself in his debut season in 2019 when he achieved the rare feat of scoring a century in both his maiden First XI game as well as in his debut Big Match against Trinity.

Thisara Ekanayake makes national U19 Debut

Thisara Ekanayake, our 2024 skipper, made a promising debut for the Sri Lanka U19 team against England U19, leading his side to a convincing 65-run

victory in the first Youth ODI at Chelmsford in late June.

Thisara, who opened the batting with Rajan Pulindu Perera, scored 13 runs and then took two of the first three wickets, stalling the home side's run chase. He bowled his full quota of 10 overs, finishing with figures of 2/48.

In the 2023/24 school cricket season, Thisara was outstanding with both the bat, scoring 964 runs in 24 innings at an average of 48.2 with 4 centuries and 4 fifties, and capturing 54 wickets including 3 five-wicket hauls and one 10-wicket match bag.



Just in the last three years, no less than seven Antonians have represented SL at U19 level, a remarkable feat that is unparalleled in the annals of our history. Along with Thisara, we had Chamidu Wickremasinghe, Trevin Mathew, Lahiru Abeysinghe, Anjala Bandara, Asitha Wanninayake and Kaveesha Piyumal donning the national cap at U19 level.

If the performances of our junior cricketers are any indication, our success is bound to extend into the future, provided they continue to grow as well-rounded players. However, it's important to remember that achieving this will require ongoing support from the Antonian community towards the school and the Cricket Wing.



This pairs finest performance was against St.Joseph's college at Darley Road in 1956 when they skittled the Josephians out for 51. The next day the sports section of the "Ceylon Daily News" carried the following headline " BERENGER JOSEPH AND BOWL WITH

VENOM - JOES ALL OUT FOR 51 !" Both were good batsmen too and Steven opened the innings in 1955 in the match against St.Peter's. He fared even better in athletics and was one of the finest athletes produced by St.Anthony's College.

In an era of several outstanding athletes like R.A.F.Perera, (100m and 200m) Ranjith Samarasekera, (Javelin) Jeeva Weerasinghe (Long Jump), 100m Lesley Jayabandhu, (400m) W.B.Rajaguru, (800m) A.H.B.Rajaguru, (800m) Ivan Boteju, 200m and 400 m) and Edmund Cooray, (100m and 200m) Steven was the best, winning the 100 and 200 metres at the Central province Schools Meet where St. Anthony's annually swept the board.

At the Public Schools Meet in Colombo he came second in the 100m being pipped at the tape by Samuel of Wesley college. He went on to represent Ceylon at these events and won the 100 m in India at an international meet. His tall frame was an advantage at the High Jump and he had a close battle with Ranjit Samarasekera at

the College Annual Sports Meet before winning the event. Apart from cricket and athletics, Steven was a senior cadet, a Prefect and a member of the college choir.

CHARLIE JOSEPH

Charlie excelled at cricket from a very young age and represented college from 1956 - 1961. He captained the side in 1959 and 1960 and won the coveted trophy for "The Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year" Award in both years. Charlie possessed a superb text book batting technique and was by far the best batsman in schools during these years.

He scored centuries against all the schools he played. Some of the finest were against St.Peter's at Bambalapitiya, St.Benedict's at Kotahena, and Trinity and Dharmarajah at Katugastota. But perhaps two of his greatest mini innings were two which were below 100. One was against Ananda college at Campbell Place in 1957 when he was just 16 years old.

St. Anthonys were in a bad way tottering on 104 for 7 when Charlie and a little-known Heen Banda rose like the Phoenix from the ashes salvaging a partnership, which took the total to 210. He was unbeaten on 80 when the innings ended.

Quoting an extract from the College Magazine of the time, Afzal Laphir states " Charlie Joseph then sizing up the situation pinned his faith on aggression and took the bowling apart with a superb 80...." When Ananda batted it was their turn to collapse and they were 45 for 7 at the close of play. However, the next day they staged a recovery and managed to force a draw.

His other great 'mini innings' was he scored 73 against St.Joseph's at Darley Road in 1960. St.Joseph's had one of the best opening bowling attacks with Peter Livanage and Raniit Malawana and the famed spin duo of Priya Perera (off spin) and Raja de Silva (leg spin) taking over with the old ball. We managed only 135 runs out of which Charlie scored 73, 55% of the total. Running out of partners he lashed out and was caught at the boundary by a superb catch taken by Victor Wickremasinghe. Had the latter missed, it was a sure six!

In his first year in 1956 the team was labelled "The Anthonian Batting Machine" by the Press and comprised batsmen of the calibre of W.Premaratne, Ranjit Doranegama, Anton Rambukpotha, Srilal Seneviratne, Ranjit Samarasekera, and Thirunavakarasu. Charlie batted down the order and never had the chance of batting for long. But he did very well as an off spinner. If Ceylon had test status, Charlie would have been an automatic choice. Apart from cricket he was a member of the pioneering rugger team started by Reverend Brother Macky, and also represented college in Athletics. At the Central Province Schools Group Meet held in Asgiriya, he was a member of the winning U19 4 x 100 relay team in record setting time. As mentioned, Charlie would have excelled in any chosen ball game being blessed with inborn skills. He also played football tennis and basketball with equal skill. Charlie was also the Head Prefect in 1960 and was much admired by his fellow students, the staff, old boys and well-wishers.

MICHAEL JOSEPH

Like his brothers, Michael had a natural skill for ball games and excelled in cricket. He scored a glorious century in a partnership with Charlie against Dharmarajah college in 1961 when the chips were down. At this particular stage of the game we were in dire straits not just facing a freight train coming in the opposite direction, but facing a bullet train, in the form of T.B Kehelgamuwa!! The wonder of this century is that he scored it before he had scored a half century in any of the previous matches. But this was a harbinger of things to come.

Michael made many more big scores including a scintillating 81 against a strong Royal attack in 1962. Later he also became a good medium fast bowler and had outstanding big performance against Trinity in 1963 when he captained the team. In that match he had a haul of 5 wickets for 67 runs. Trinity were on the verge of defeat at Asgiriya when a sudden downpour came to their aid snatching them from the iaws of defeat. It seemed the weather Gods favoured Trinity whenever the "Big Match" was played at Asgiriya because they were also saved from defeat in 1952 when the heavens opened up! Michael also represented college in rugger and was a Senior Prefect.

St. Anthonys was blessed with outstanding cricketers in the latter half of the 50's. But it is very sad to state that among them, Ranjit Doranegama, (Captain in 1957) Anton Rambukpotha, (Vice Captain Srilal Seneviratne, 1957) (Captain in 1958) Charlie Joseph, (Captain in 1959 and 1960) and Thirunavakarusu, all passed away at a relatively young age. And we who are left to grieve, will always be grateful for the privilege of having witnessed their stellar achievements if only for a short period. We are thankful for the gifts given to us. Their memories are enshrined forever in the annals of our Alma Mater.

Refurbished Rugby Boots Project

Diehard old Antonian Palitha Anthony, based in Negambo, Sri Lanka in his quest to find solutions to the multitude of issues facing the Antonian fraternity was instrumental in initiating this project. Cost escalation of all items in Sri Lanka is the order of the day and Rugby boots are no exception. Purchasing a pair of Rugby boots is prohibitive to most households in Sri Lanka. Palitha spoke to his good friend in Sydney Shane Thambimuththu on the issue and Shane immediately started collecting boots in Sydney.

Shane wanted our assistance to collect boots from Melbourne and so we did and along with the boots collected by Shane, in 2023 we dispatched 65 refurbished boots and Rugby shorts to

college in 2 boxes (Tea chests) and we also added an additional box of lady's clothes and shoes for the support staff. This year we continued with the project and sent 39 refurbished boots & 26 joggers in 2 boxes and also another 2 boxes of ladies' clothes, shoes and hand bags.

Last year, Shane along with his classmate Manoj Wijekulasuriya and son Tehan were the main contributors. Christy Peter and Jinendra Bandara too assisted. This year Manoj, Christy, Norman Thompson with his family, Kapila Kasthuriyarachchi and Titus Peter contributed along with some others who wished to remain anonymous. Four ladies, spouses of our members, too contributed and wanted their names withheld.

We also acknowledge the efforts of the Antonian Rugby Board and group 85 members Nalinda Suriyampola, Jayantha Mantilake and Maurice Joachim in coordinating and distributing back at the receiving end. We wish to continue this project with the collections made immediately after the Oval / Football season that culminates by the end of winter. We will concentrate only on collecting Rugby boots hereafter. We have around 40 players in the U19 squad, 25 in the U18 squad, 30 in the U16 squad 25 each in the U12 & U14 (2 teams each), with a total of over 145 Rugby players. We also have Hockey & Football teams using the same type of boots. The potential to help is enormous.

Padua Building: A Chronicle of Triumphs and Challenges

Amidst jubilant celebrations marking the 170th anniversary of St. Anthony's College, a historic moment unfolded with the inauguration of the Padua Building on March 12th, 2024. Valued at LKR 35.9 million, this architectural gem, envisioned by Rev. Fr. Titus Rodrigo OSB and designed by distinguished Old Boy Chartered Architect Gayan Herat, is a testament to the institution's commitment to modern education ideals.

Thanks to generous donations from parents, alumni, and well-wishers, and under the guidance of Principal Rev. Fr.

Henry Bernard Wijeratne OSB and with the active involvement of SACKOBA Central Council, our modern facility is now a reality.

Construction began on April 5th, 2016, with the aim of completion by 2019. COVID -19 and economic challenges caused unavoidable delays and cost increase. In 2021, prioritisina completion, five floors were constructed to address urgent needs. including classrooms conducting essential extra subjects at an advanced level, as well as labs for the A/L

technology stream, classrooms, alongside essential facilities such as a library, auditorium, archives, museum, and clerical and bursar offices, as well as improved accommodation facilities for visiting teams.

Finally, on March 12th, 2024, amidst great joy and celebration, the new Padua Building was handed over to the colleae community, symbolising physical structure and a testament to beloved institution's resilience, vision, and unwavering spirit.


