In his homily Father Treesen reminded everyone that St Joseph, our patron saint, besides his caring and devotion to his family, was declared the patron saint of the universal church by Pope Pius IX.

As is customary on these occasions the Old Joes sang the College Anthem in their usual gusty rendition. The music provided by Claude and Lalith of Fiesta set the mood and rhythm for dancing.

After a very sumptuous dinner catered by Flavour of Ceylon and enjoyed by all, emcee Aubrey Joachim conducted an auction for a cricket ball signed by Chaminda Vaas, Old Joe and Sri Lanka text cricketer. Aubrey mentioned that Chaminda had the longest name of any international cricketer; he took 355 test wickets. The auction raised \$400 and will go towards providing scholarships for needy students at St Joseph's.

The very enjoyable evening was due to the efforts of President Lalith, who co-ordinated the event, assisted by Vice President Fidel Moldrich, and the rest of the Committee. Campion Fernando once again provided a pleasing table decor.



### Old Joes Sydney T10 cricket champions



The inaugural Sri Lankan Schools T10 Cricket Tournament organised by Lanka Lion Sports Club was played on 12 January 2025 at the Kareela Reserve in Doonside, western Sydney. Eight Sri Lankan school OBAs based in Sydney competed in this year's competition. Owing to bad weather forecast towards the afternoon and evening, the tournament was shortened to eight overs a side to speed up the match with nine players in each side.

A large crowd from the OBAs gathered to support their respective teams. Old Joes Sydney was in Group A with Wesley, Prince of Wales and Colombo Hindu and St Peters, Royal, Maliyadeva and Combined School team were in Group B.

Matches were played in two adjoining grounds, with live music and Sri Lankan food a welcome addition.

Old Joes Sydney had three first round matches beating Wesley and Prince of Wales easily by batting second but lost to Colombo Hindu by a few runs in the first round. Our well-balanced side had experienced Darius Visser smashing explosive sixes and guiding the team with the rest of the players contributing consistently.

Sohan Rodrigo, a steady allrounder, captained Old Joes Sydney assisted by Darius Visser, Nawodh Fernando, Shehan Fernando, Ashan Wickramanayaka, Rajinda Wijeratne, Chamara Arachchi, Avinash Mirando, Jehan

Polwatta and Upeka Perera. The tournament rules allowed one player from another school to be included because most teams had difficulty filling the numbers. Thomian wicketkeeper Nawodh Fernando was added to Old Joes Sydney team.

Solid economical bowling spells by Avinash, assisted by part-time medium pace by Rajinda and Sohan, some quality leg spin by Darius, good slow off spin by Ashan, Jehan and Chamara helped the team to reach the finals. Darius displayed his skills in these situations, with exciting batting in the first round where he single-handedly carried wins against Wesley and Prince of Wales smashing huge sixes to the car park and adjoining road, while Nawodh, Jehan and Sohan contributed well with the bat to help the team reach the required target.

After the first round matches, the expected thundershowers forced the organisers to postpone the semifinals and finals to 16 February to make sure all four teams were available to play the full T10 match format.

On a beautiful Sunday morning on 16 February the Old Joes Sydney met their arch rivals, St Peters, in their semifinal while Maliyadeva took on Colombo Hindu.

St Peters won the toss and decided to bat first and managed to get only 88 runs in the allocated ten overs. The reliable opening partnership of Darius and Nawodh helped Old Joes Sydney to get a good start but wickets kept falling at the other end while Darius was consolidating his patient innings trying to take Old Joes Sydney to the target. In the tenth over Old Joes Sydney required 14 runs. Darius managed to score a four and a six on the third and fourth ball to take Old Joes Sydney to victory. A regular catch at the lines was dropped costing the Peterites the match. Jubilant Old Joes Sydney marched through to the finals taking a step closer to the Trophy. Darius was unbeaten with a score of 45.

In the other semifinal the much fancied Colombo Hindu won against Maliyadeva in a high scoring match. Hindu scored 122 to Maliyadeva's 110.

The much anticipated final was played in the afternoon before a large crowd. Colombo Hindu won the toss and batted first. Tight bowling by Old Joes Sydney restricted them to a total of 114. Darius and Nawodh opened the batting and the Old Joes Sydney lost the first wicket of Nawodh with the score at 14. Jehan Polwatta was promoted to bat at number three. The stylish left hander played quality cover drives and pull shots before getting out when the score was 35.

A much needed partnership was expected when

Skipper Sohan went to bat at number four. He built a solid partnership with Darius to take Old Joes closer to the total. Some tight bowling and excellent fielding by Colombo Hindu slowed down the Old Joes Sydney with 16 runs needed in the last over.

Sohan, as expected, rose to the occasion and smashed two sixes and a four in his innings of 28 not out. Darius faced the last few balls smashing a two and a six. To win on the last ball Darius smashed a thundering boundary to secure the inaugural T10 shield to Old Joes Sydney. Darius' 56 not out was the highlight of the game.

Darius Visser swept all the awards and the jubilant Old Joes Sydney were crowned inaugural Sri Lanka Schools T10 Cricket Champions with the trophy and a cash prize.

Thank you to the organisers, Lanka Lions Sports Club, for setting up a fantastic tournament and thanks to the Old Joes Sydney players who were determined and sacrificed their personal commitments to participate in this tournament.
